Dear friends in dance:

After a year-and-a-half hiatus, we are delighted to invite you back to the Wenatchee Feis, hosted by An Daire Academy of the Irish Dance with the Pacific Celtic Foundation. Thank you for joining us for a celebration of Irish dance in Washington's North Cascades!

We are pleased to once again host our inaugural year's events in the Wenatchee High School Theater. To maintain the health and safety of the competitors and spectators, and to conform to public health regulations, we will conform to the following Covid-19 protocols:

- Grades will dance no more than two at a time on 24' x 24' stages.
- Championships will conform to the Western U.S. Oireachtas rules, dancing no more than two at a time on a 24' x 40' stage.
- Wenatchee High School is requiring that those entering the building will need to electronically fill out a contact tracing form online. The link will be available on FeisWorx, and competitors and spectators will need to show their green check mark after they have completed it to gain admission to the building.
- Dancers and spectators should be masked at all times; dancers may remove their masks to dance.
- Competitions will be scheduled by age category. Dancers and their guardians will be
 permitted entry to the auditorium immediately prior to their competition, and the hall will
 be completely cleared before the next competition will be admitted.
- To limit contact, dancers will print their own competitor numbers.
- To limit contact, there will be no awards ceremonies: results will be posted on the FeisWorx website, and trophies may be collected at the registration table. A complimentary podium will be set up outside on which you may take photos.

Amendments to the syllabus and attendee regulations may be required up to finalization of competition timetable in order to ensure a safe event for all.

Thank you for your understanding, and we look forward to seeing you back in Wenatchee!

Competition Rules

- 1. Rules adopted by the Western US Region of IDTANA, member CLRG, are included by reference.
- 2. Rules and requirements for each competition as noted in the syllabus are included by reference.
- 3. Competitors must be in the hall prepared to dance one hour prior to the scheduled start of their event.
- 4. Competitions with fewer than five entrants may be combined or canceled by the Feis Committee; the Feis Committee may add or combine competitions at its discretion.
- 5. Competitors must be in costume, including soft shoes, to receive awards presented from stage.
- 6. An Daire Academy of Irish Dance, Pacific Celtic Foundation, the Feis Committee, Wenatchee High School, and anyone associated in producing the feis, including feis volunteers, shall not be held responsible or liable for any personal injury, property loss, or damage.
- 7. Entry constitutes acceptance of the rules and restrictions outlined herein.

Blackout (Saturday) Costume Rules

- Costume for all dancers, Beginners through Champions, is modest black attire; NO dance costumes are permitted.
- 2. Suggested attire for girls/ladies is a skirt or skort with tights or socks; boys/gents may wear long pants.
- 3. Either long or short- sleeve shirts are acceptable; boys/gents should not wear ties, vests or jackets.
- 4. Girls/ladies hair should be pulled back neatly from the face; no wigs, crowns, tiaras or hairpieces. Light or no make-up is encouraged, with stud earrings only.
- 5. All costuming must conform to the costume requirements set forth by CLRG.
- 6. Branded attire (ie Nike, Adidas, etc.) should be small and discreet; NO school branded attire is permitted on stage.
- 7. No "bling" is permitted on any performance costumes (ie. skirts, pants, tops, buckles, etc.).

Western U.S. Region Level Definitions & Advancement

- 1. First Feis is not per dance, but the first feis **ever** for the dancer. Only one first feis regardless of how many dances they are doing. Dancers may only enter First Feis once, even in case of back-to-back feiseanna.
- 2. In Beginner, Advanced Beginner, and Novice the following will apply:
 - a. 5 9 dancers: 1st place will advance to the next grade.
 - b. 10 or more dancers: 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade.
 - c. Dancers may **not** stay in level at Teacher discretion.
- 3. Prizewinner: Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.
- 4. Preliminary to Open Championship: Must have 3 overall wins with 5 or more dancers, **not** at teacher discretion. Upon winning their 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back feiseanna.
- 5. Adults: Dancers who started after the age of 18 or have not competed for 5 years.
- 6. Dancers residing outside the Western U.S. Region should consult the rules for advancement within the region in which they reside.
